## 1. General

The Inclusive Skating World Championships 2026 will be held from Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June to Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> June 2026 during the Glasgow 2026 Festival in the lead up to the for the Commonwealth Games which are held from 23 July to 2<sup>nd</sup> August. Additional social and cultural activities are in active planning for Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> June and local activities are planned for Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> June.

## 2. Location

East Kilbride Ice Rink, Olympia Shopping Centre, 300 Cornwall St, East Kilbride, Glasgow G74 1PG, Scotland, UK

The rink is on the outskirts of the city of Glasgow, just a stone's throw from East Kilbride Shopping Centre and Calderglen Country Park. The rink is less than half an hour's drive from Glasgow Airport, and Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park can be reached in an hour.

East Kilbride is an Ice Rink and has limited seating capacity at rink side and in the coffee area adjacent to the rink. The ice surface is Approx 50m x 25m. The facility is heated and is fully covered. The rink is in the Olympia shopping Centre and has excellent parking available (for a small fee) and a wide range of shops including food and coffee outlets nearby within the shopping mall.



### 3. Entry

Entry is available to skaters directly through the Sport 80 platform. Registration and a skater membership with Inclusive Skating is required for entry. Here are the links

Skaters with any form of impairment may enter the competition, including visual, hearing, biomechanical, intellectual or any impairment that functionally limits ice skating. The functioning of the skater for ice skating is assessed during classification. The classification process follows the Code of Classification and the Classification Handbook for Inclusive Skating.

Each skater is individually assessed during classification by the Classification Panel and has an assessment of the whole person impairment percentage that reflects their impairment.

The whole person impairment percentage is then used to calculate the impairment compensation to be added to the skater's skating score.

Skaters who have been classified at previous Inclusive Skating Events do not require to be classified again unless there has been a material change in their functioning.

There are no test entry requirements and skaters should with the guidance of their coach choose the technical elements closest to their current ability. The Inclusivepara rules will apply and no level results will be awarded

A permit to include a VIRTUS athletes is in place and additional eligibility requirements with VIRTUS will apply for the VIRTUS events. Decisions in relation to VIRTUS eligibility are decided by VIRTUS. If skaters are not eligible to compete as a VIRTUS athlete then they will still be eligible to compete under their Inclusive skating classification.

Further permits are in process and additional classification and eligibility requirements may apply.

#### 4. Technical Information

The Technical Handbook 10th Edition (2025) as amended on 1.1.2025 and the Classification Handbook 6th Edition as amended will apply. Please download the latest version from the website. Some minor amendments to accommodate VIRTUS eligibility processes are planned.

Skaters may perform their current program based on level requirements and there are no deductions if skaters cannot

comply with the rules. Each element will be evaluated and credit given through the grade of execution for the element and/ or the program component scores.

We seek to minimise changes that the skaters make to their current programmes and invite skaters to communicate with us for assistance as necessary.

## 5. Event and Entry Fee Information

The full range of skating events specified on the Sport 80 platform are available for entry. The entry fee is £50 for each solo competitor with an additional £10 fee for each event entered.

There is a separate team event entry for each team entering synchro. Each team should make a separate entry for each team. One person makes the entry on behalf of all team members. The fee depends on the size of the team.

£30 for duets, trios and quartets

£40 for groups of 5 to 9

£50 for teams of 10 to 16

Skaters must use ice skates to take part in the event at East Kilbride.

If skaters wish to participate on skating wheels please use the expression of interest event and separate arrangements may be made available if there is sufficient interest.

## 6. Video Entry Information

Video entry is permitted only on specific application and as approved and as necessary under the skater's classification. Where permitted video is available for all figure skating events that are available during the main event and results will be included in the Virtual results only. Skaters permitted to provide

a video should fill out the entry form in the usual way. Videos must be recorded during 2026. Skaters should provide a single performance and video for a program. Results for the virtual events will be posted after the location event.

## 7. Classification and Eligibility

Skaters who require classification should

1. Enter the expression of interest for classification event. Here's the link:

2. provide pre-recorded video entry of their current compulsory elements performed on skates prior to the closing date.

Classification will be undertaken primarily through online video conference call and will be subject to review at the event and for further period of time as required. This is usually a minimum of 2 years and in all cases relating to children until adulthood.

Skaters previously classified should enter the day that they are filling in the entry form as a date needs to be provided in the form. Inclusive Skating records skater's current classification information in the current World Rankings so the precise date of classification is not important.

Skaters wishing to be included in the VIRTUS results must obtain VIRTUS international eligibility.

Additional international and national eligibility and results may be provided. TBC

## 8. Medals

Medals will be awarded, and skaters will be invited to be presented at the presentation ceremony.

## 9. PPC – planned program content sheets and Music

The planned program content sheets and Music are requested in a google doc form which will be e-mailed to all participants.

## 10. Responsibility

All participants act on their own responsibility.

Inclusive Skating and the IS Skating Event Organising Committee accepts no liability or responsibility with respect to personal injury or for property loss or damage incurred by competitors, facilitators or officials or other participants in any capacity in connection with the IS World Championships 2026 or any part of the event.

The organiser will seek to provide a system for medical emergency aid during competition.

It is the sole obligation of each participant to provide their own medical and accident insurance. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditious means.

## 11. Publicity

Skaters and their facilitators, coaches, families, carers and guardians, volunteers and officials hereby acknowledge and consent to the fact that skater's and event photos, information and results will be published, and parts of the event may be televised for showing on a worldwide basis and/or made available on the Inclusive Skating website and social media channels. (Confidential medical information will not be disclosed.) Skaters, their parents/guardians and coaches hereby certify and warrant that the music and choreography presented and used by the Competitors have been fully cleared and authorised for public use and consent to use of his or her name, biography and likeness on or in connection with any television or radio programme broadcast and re-broadcast throughout the world, motion picture, print media or the advertising and publicising of such programme, without further clearance or payments of any kind on the side of the Organising Committee, Inclusive Skating, Special Olympics GB and the relevant television network or broadcasters being required.

Videos are uploaded onto the Inclusive Skating YouTube Channel and are a public record of the event.

The taking of video and photography within the arena is prohibited unless the participants have provided written consent. An official photographer may be present at the event. In any event, if parents or guardians wish to video or photograph their own children then they may obtain a video/ photography permit, which will allow them to video/ photograph a named individual(s) from a designated area in the arena. Permission for this may be granted in advance of the event.

## 12. Cancellation

The entry costs are subsidised, and the entry fee paid by the skater will not be refunded under any circumstance as the entry

fee reflects the costs of setting up the event and not the true cost of the event.

Skaters are invited to use the insurance option available on the entry platform to cover the cost of cancellation and their refunds.

The event will be subject to cancellation and there is no liability on the part of the organisers if this is necessary. If for any reason the event is cancelled, then the organisers will seek to hold the event virtually and all entries will be automatically transferred.

### 13. Anti-doping

Anti-doping control is a requirement for VIRTUS events so anti-doping compliance will operate during the event. Competitors are advised that they should always act in accordance with WADA and all anti-doping regulations even when not participating in the VIRTUS event.

### 14. Music Information

Skaters should comply with guidelines for music copyright.

The music form is replicated for your convenience. The music form should be completed when competing in this event (as it provides the license information should the event be broadcast on the BBC etc.)

This form must be completed by the closing date for the event.

A separate form should be completed for each event entered.

All skaters are requested to bring a backup copy of the music to the event.

Music must be uploaded in the google doc form that will be e-mailed to the participants.

## Guidance

Every ice rink will have a music licence a combined PRS / PPL licence which gives them the right to play or perform music in public. This licence covers skaters on patch, in competitions and shows to play music tracks. The overarching licence tolerates tracks that are not fully licenced.

These licences do not however cover broadcasts or making it available online.

The BBC and other broadcast broadcasters have a zero tolerance or non-compliant music tracks across their channels. This means that even though you can play out any track in the rink under the blanket music licence you may not be able to play it out online or via a streamed broadcast or a or on a specific TV show.

Inclusive Skating aims to increase broadcasting within events. However, copyright needs to be taken seriously for this progression to be feasible. For example, the BBC operates 100% MCPS licencing policy. This means that all tracks must be fully performing right society (PRS) and phonographic performance limited (PPL) licence or if they have parts unlicensed then the unlicensed artist label lyricist must have given Inclusive Skating written permission for the music to play on the BBC broadcast.

Other broadcasters have different policies so lesser compliance levels may enable music to be played on other channels as has been the case currently on YouTube.

However, in the event of a BBC highlight show they will opt to leave that programme with unlicensed music out of the show due to non-compliance with copyright. Tracks need to be purchased. If a track is purchased by iTunes this is an initial indicated that the artist and label have licenced their track with the relevant licencing agencies.

Here's some tips

- Do not use a unique version of a track from YouTube unless you can also find on a music purchasing site too.
- Do your homework before you decide on the music you choose on sites such as [www.discog.com](http://www.discog.com)

Ultimately the liability sits with the skater and all the parents of the skater and not the coach, Inclusive Skating, or the broadcaster.

Inclusive Skating may check the music when you enter an event. If your tracks are not compliant then the skater may be notified, and copyright authorisation will be required.

Without copyright in place your track will be muted across any live broadcasting platform and viewers will see you skate in silence. You may be edited out of any on demand features or highlights programmes.

For the BBC and similar channels, the music track must be licenced on multiple levels: the artist, the original artist if it is a cover version, the writers and the record companies.

Some tracks do not have these licences. They may only be licenced for YouTube or not for public performance or they may be totally unlicensed. If you choose one of these tracks, you must obtain permission from the rights holder to use their track on the broadcast. They may want you to pay for this or they may give permission free of charge.

## 15. Accommodation and Travel

East Kilbride and local hotels are easily accessible by taxi from Glasgow Airport.

Transport from hotel to the rink must be organised by the skater.

The Organising Committee does not pay travel or lodging expenses for the skaters.

All of our hotel recommendations are budget friendly options as we want the event to be as accessible as possible to all our participants and attendees. We are happy to help you investigate alternative options if required.

The journey between East Kilbride and Glasgow Central is 30 minutes.
