

#### Looking Forward

There is considerable interest internationally for the development of Inclusive Skating and we will be looking to developing programs that deliver virtual activities and systems for other associations to collaborate with Inclusive Skating.

We particularly look forward to the first Location Event after Covid (now successfully held at the time of writing) at Hamilton Ice rink from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> April 2023 and the third Virtual World Inclusive Skating Championships in 2023. The Virtual Championships are now planned to be a permanent feature of Inclusive Skating and will compliment future Venue based events with a hybrid structure and will continue to be part of the World Ice Skating Day activities.

Challenges are that with growing interest in Inclusive Skating activities we must train up more volunteers to deliver events and coaching activities.

Challenges will be continuing to provide training and coaching support for the virtual activities at no charge to the community because the current funding is only available in Scotland

Whatever the challenges the next year will bring the charity has a sound financial foundation for 2022 to 2023 and a growing volunteer base to look forward to a bright future that brings more safe and enjoyable opportunities to a happy community.
