


#### Organised but informal events











### Single-club or single-school events

Participant, parent, spectator, staff member, coach or volunteer identifies concerns about possible/alleged abuse or poor practice If child needs immediate medical attention, contact emergency services and inform member of the safeguarding team immediately

Person with lead safeguarding responsibility at event (eg club welfare officer, designated teacher)

Decide if this is:

poor practice

Inform event organiser:

Decide whether to immediately exclude from event

Consult with/refer to the police or children's social care

Initiate organisation's disciplinary process

If concern relates to staff member, coach or volunteer, agree if/when/how to initiate the organisation's disciplinary process and refer to LADO (England)



#### Regional or national events

Participant, parent, team manager, spectator, staff member, coach or volunteer identifies concerns about possible/alleged abuse or poor practice, or any other wider welfare issues.

If child needs immediate medical attention, contact emergency services and inform member of the safeguarding team immediately

Sport safeguarding officer

Sport safeguarding coordinator

#### Initial response team

(Event safeguarding manager, event organiser and other representatives as required eg chief medical officer)
Review all reported issues/concerns and agree most appropriate initial route for support/solution
Safeguarding concerns
or Broader welfare concerns

Event safeguarding panel
(Chaired by event safeguarding manager with three sport safeguarding coordinators/officers and, where possible, representative from statutory agency)
Considers all concerns about poor practice and abuse and decides on appropriate action

alleged abuse Or poor practice

Decide whether to immediately exclude, refer to statutory agencies and/or inform the relevant sport organiser Inform relevant sport organiser about concern and make recommendations about sanctions, immediate exclusion or further disciplinary action Broader welfare issues, such as catering, transport; accommodation; facilities, venues and kit










#### International events

Participant, parent, team manager, spectator, staff member, coach or volunteer identifies concerns about possible/alleged abuse or poor practice, or any other wider welfare issues

If child needs immediate medical attention, contact emergency services and inform member of the safeguarding team immediately



Sport safeguarding coordinator in consultation with sport coordinator/head of delegation

Consider all concerns about poor practice and abuse; decide on appropriate action, including referral to statutory agencies abroad and/or in UK; initiation of disciplinary process; and contacting parents
